BI 201 - New Testament Survey

Tuesdays 6:30-8:30 p.m., August 15-September 26, Room 302

A course presenting the background and message of the New Testament featuring the books that are primarily significant to Israel as well as "The Pauline Epistles." Significant features of each book are pointed out. *(Required for graduation.)*

BI 220 - Handling Hot Topics of Our Day

Saturdays 9-11 a.m., August 19-September 30, Room 302

Learn what the Bible teaches about current issues such as alcoholism, gambling, capital punishment, homosexuality, marriage and divorce, and more. *(Required for Pastoral, Biblical Counseling, and Women's Ministry Majors.)*

CM 206 - Biblical Counseling 1

Mondays 6-8 p.m., October 9-November 20, Room 302

An overview of biblical counseling covering topics like "Who is *competent* to counsel?" and "Is there compatibility between Biblical Counselors and psychologists and psychiatrists?" *(Required for graduation.)*

This class aims to educate the student about the heritage of Deaf people in the United States. Before one can effectively reach the Deaf, one must understand the unique linguistic/ cultural perspective of the Deaf.
